

Thrive RISE Winter Social Media Toolkit

Use this social media toolkit throughout winter to update the community on how to best prepare for an environmental disaster related to winter storms (flooding, landslides, thunderstorms, etc.)

PREPARING FOR STORM SEASON



- Subscribe to SMCAlert to stay notified during emergencies
 - Register online at www.smcgov.org/dem/smc-alert
- Sign up for your city's Nixle emergency alerts by texting your zip code to 888777
- Sign up for alerts through PG&E to be notified about energy issues during a power outage
 - Update your contact information on your account and accept "outage alerts"
 - o Call (866) 743-6589
- Pack your "Go bag" packed with water, nonperishable foods, important documents, medicine, etc.
- Follow your jurisdiction for possible sandbag locations

Caption: Storm season is approaching! Make sure your household is prepared for potential heavy rains, flooding, and high winds. Stock up on essentials, stay informed, and create an emergency plan to keep your family safe for winter weather.



General Flood Warning Post (November-March)



- ✓ Stock up on essentials: groceries, water, medicine, sandbags
- Prepare for power outages: charge power banks, keep electronics at high battery levels
- ✓ Subscribe to SMCAlert for emergency notifications
- Avoid unnecessary travel during inclement weather
- Check on your neighbors, especially older adults and people with disabilities
- Clear nearby storm drains of leaves and other debris

Caption: Heavy rains are expected in San Mateo County in the coming days, increasing the risk of flooding and landslides. THROW AWAY ITEMS THAT CAN'T BE COMPLETELY CLEANED AND DRIED QUICKLY

- Mattresses, carpets, upholstered and leather furniture, cushions and pillows, wood veneer furniture, and other porous items should be thrown away if they came into contact with flood water
- Take photos of these items before discarding them if you plan to file an insurance claim

STOP MOLD FROM SPREADING IN YOUR HOME'S STRUCTURE

- Check crawlspaces/basements for dampness.
- Check materials most susceptible to mold when wet: drywall, ceiling tile, foam, cardboard, paper, particle board.
- If walls are wet, remove drywall & baseboards to allow area to dry.
- Open windows and use dehumidifiers to improve air flow and reduce moisture.
- Remove excess water with mops or a wet vacuum or a pump.
- Do NOT use central furnace/air-conditioning system if you suspect that the ducts were flooded. If there is mold present, this may blow spores throughout your home.

DID YOUR HOUSE GET WET DURING A LEAK OR FLOODING?

Take care of the moisture immediately and find support:

- Call (650) 599-1112 to file a complaint with SMC Environmental Health Services if you live in a rental property (apartment buildings of 4 units or more) with mold
 Report if your living space is a violation of The California Health & Safety Code (HSC §17920.3)
- Read California Department of Public Health (CDPH) Mold Guidance Booklet
- Find a Mold Inspection & Testing Contractor near you
 If mold is found, hire a Mold Removal & Remediation service if you cannot clean it yourself
